## Structure and Themes

The **five-day programme** combines morning lectures and afternoon discussions, workshops and student presentations.

**Main themes** include:

- labour market **policies**, employment services and precarious work
- **discriminations** and inequalities at work
- youth, welfare and new forms of **poverty**
- **migrations**, citizenship and belonging
- youth activism, **new social movements** and social innovation.

**Teaching staff** includes scholars from the University of Milan and other Italian and international leading universities.

A final **round table** with representatives from Assifero, Ashoka and AnciLAB will connect academic debates with policy and practice.

## Aims and Focus

The NextGen@Work Summer School aims to provide participants with **conceptual and methodological tools** to understand and investigate:

- the role and status of younger generations in the **labour market** and professional sphere
- **migration** processes and their impact on youth
- **gendered inequalities** and **intersectional** dynamics shaping youth experiences of labour
- dynamics of civic participation, social movements and **youth activism**

## Learning Experience

Participants will take part in:

- **Lectures** with established international scholars
- **Workshops** and smaller group discussions
- **Student presentations**, where participants can present and receive feedback on their own work

The programme places particular emphasis on **contemporary generational experiences** in a context often described as one of **permanent crisis**, shaped by **intersecting** dimensions such as: economic instability, health crises, geopolitical tensions and conflict, labour precarity, climate change and environmental risks.

## Participants and Selection

The Summer School is open to a maximum of **20 participants**, with priority given to PhD candidates and early career researchers in sociology, political science and law. Gender balance and the relevance of applicants' research projects to the themes of the School will be considered in the selection.

## Fees

**There is no participation fee.**

Selected participants will have **access free of charge to lunches, welcome events, teaching materials, and internet.**

Travel and accommodation costs are not covered, however, participants will be able to benefit from discounted accommodation rates at partner hostels affiliated with the University of Milan.

Applications must be submitted through the **online form**. Applicants are also required to send their CV and a short motivation letter to **nextgeneration.summerschool@unimi.it**.
